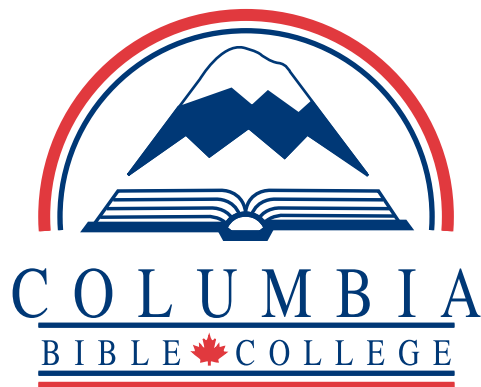

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS:

- At least 17 years of age.
- High School graduate (or equivalent) with a minimum average of 60% (2.0) in Grade 12. Courses should include English 12 (or provincial/state equivalent). Students without this English requirement will be considered on a case by case basis. Appeals for mature students (21+) who do not meet the graduation requirement are available by contacting Admissions.
- Christians who are seeking to grow in their relationship with Christ.

U.S. & INTERNATIONAL APPLICANT INFORMATION

BIG SAVINGS AND FINANCIAL AID FOR U.S. STUDENTS!

US students are typically receiving 10-15% on their tuition dollar because of the exchange rate from US to Canadian Dollars. This means savings for quality Christian Education! To see today's exchange rate from US to Canadian dollars, visit the currency converter at www.xe.com. Columbia Bible College also offers several bursaries and scholarships which US students are eligible to apply for (please see the financial aid section of our website). Columbia is also eligible for Stafford Loans. To apply for federal financial aid, students must complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). **Please note:** You must contact FAFSA after you have applied online to ask them to send us a hard copy of the Student Aid Report (SAR). STUDENT AUTHORIZATION (VISA)

Any student wishing to study in Canada who is not a Canadian citizen or permanent resident must obtain a student authorization before entering Canada. Once you are accepted by Columbia Bible College as a full-time student, we will send you the information necessary for you to obtain your visa with your acceptance letter. You will also be required to show the immigration officers evidence of adequate funds. The visa officer will expect you be able to support yourself (and family if applicable) during your program of study. You may be required to bring financial documents to prove you have the necessary funds (bank statements, scholarship & bursary awards, pledges, etc.). **The processing fee is \$125 (Canadian Funds).**
For U.S. students: The issuance of your student authorization takes place when you arrive in Canada - at the airport or at any vehicle Port of Entry.
International students (non-US): The issuance of your student authorization must take place at least one month before your arrival. You should begin applying at least 3 months before expected arrival. Under no circumstance should you leave for Canada until you have received confirmation from Columbia regarding your acceptance, and have obtained your entry visa and student authorization. It is not possible to change from visitor to student status within Canada—you have to leave the country to do this. You will also be required to obtain a return ticket or evidence that funds will be available for that purpose. You may also be required to show proof of medical clearance (depending on country of residence).

STUDENTS WHOSE FIRST LANGUAGE IS NOT ENGLISH

In order to be accepted, a foreign student, whose first language is not English, must have a minimum score of 550 for the paper based TOEFL or 213 for the computer based TOEFL or 79 for the internet based TOEFL. Students must arrange to be tested by an approved agency in their country. Students should do this at least two (2) months prior to the beginning of the semester. This will allow time for the results to be returned to Columbia. **Acceptance at CBC will be dependent on receiving these test scores.** For TOEFL information, please contact: TOEFL Program Office—International Testing & Training Programs Tel (609) 951-1675 Fax (609) 520-1093 www.toefl.org. International students please note re: medical insurance:

International Students should ensure that they have a minimum of 3 months of health insurance prior to arrival in Canada. After 3 months, students are eligible for BC Medical Coverage at a nominal fee. Students have the option of remaining on an existing plan, especially if covered by their parent's medical plan. You should check with your current insurance carrier prior to departure to ensure you have adequate coverage. If applying for BC Medical, we encourage you to begin this process immediately upon arrival in Canada as it may take the 3 months to process.

□ HIGH SCHOOL RECORDS

□ POST-SECONDARY TRANSCRIPTS

If you have been enrolled in academic work beyond high school graduation, **you must arrange to have your post-secondary transcripts sent to the Admissions Office. Photocopies cannot be accepted.** If you are enrolled in courses when applying to Columbia Bible College, please submit a transcript that shows grades completed and courses in which you are currently enrolled. Our Registrar will then be able to do a transfer analysis for you.

We will also use this picture for your student ID card so that you have it upon arrival. STUDENT LIFE COMMITMENT FORM

Columbia Bible College is a Christian college, committed to preparing students for lives of discipleship, service and ministry in the contemporary world. Admission to Columbia (through application and invitation) is open to any qualified person regardless of age, denomination, ethnicity, gender or social status. In partnership with, and accountable to the Christian church of the evangelical Anabaptist tradition (Mennonite and Mennonite Brethren), Columbia seeks to equip and affirm students as workers for various ministries of nurture, service, education, and evangelism in the church and society. In pursuit of this goal, the College seeks to promote and maintain an atmosphere of community consistent with our profession of Christian faith; one that is conducive to the growth and development of disciples of Jesus Christ. It is the expectation of the College that persons joining in the partnership of this community (students, faculty, staff and administrators) will be guided by Biblical values concerning personal holiness, respect, responsibility, integrity and grace.

COLUMBIA VALUES

Community expectations at Columbia Bible College reflect and preserve the core values of our distinctly Anabaptist character.

These core values include:

The Lordship of Jesus Christ We understand that Jesus is Lord and Savior of everyone who has responded by faith in His person and work. He is present as the Holy Spirit in the individual and the community. He accomplishes His purposes in the world, particularly through communities of believers.

The Inspiration and Authority of Scripture We believe that the whole Bible is the supreme and final authority in all matters of faith and life. The Word became alive in the person Jesus Christ and in His teaching. The person and activity of the Holy Spirit continues to give life to the Word in the experience of the believer and the church.

The Pursuit of Personal Holiness We believe that each one of us is called to grow in a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. We believe in pursuing a life of discipleship, in conformity to the teachings of Christ in the Scriptures, as evidence of living faith and effective service.

The College's Mission The mission of Columbia Bible College is to prepare students for a life of discipleship, service and ministry in current culture. A concerted effort is made to maintain an acceptable balance between being "in the world", but not "of the world"; and between conformity and individual freedom, in the development of responsible Christian character.

The Community Followers of Jesus are naturally drawn into the fellowship of believers, committed to support, accountability, correction, and ministry. In the Columbia community, we place the welfare of others and the larger community above personal preference.

This means living with integrity, credibility, and a good reputation. This may also mean limiting personal freedoms/Christian liberties for the sake of the group, or the growth of another's faith and walk. With these values in mind, Columbia Bible College anticipates that members joining its community of disciples will be thoughtful and responsible in all their actions, associations, attitudes, choices, relationships, and speech, both on and off campus.

There may be instances in which a person will not be in complete or personal agreement with every expectation or community value discussed here, and detailed in the CBC Student Handbook. Whatever you may feel about these responsibilities, we believe your decision to attend Columbia Bible College is an expression of your commitment to live within the community expectations as you participate in the life, studies, activities and ministries of the College. All members of the CBC community are responsible to:

--- Obey civil laws, and the expectations/values of this College, and to conduct themselves as responsible citizens, contributing to the welfare of the greater community (Romans 13. 1-7).

--- Obey Jesus' commandment to His disciples (John 13. 34-35), and echoed by the Apostle Paul (Romans 14; 1Corinthians 8, 13) to love one another.

--- Apply careful judgment in the exercise of personal freedoms for the sake of others, the larger community, and personal witness and growth.
(Galatians 5. 16-6. 10; Romans 12. 1-15; 1 Corinthians 8. 9-13, 13. 1-13; Ephesians 4. 17-6. 18; Colossians 3. 1-4,6; 1 Thessalonians 4. 1-5,24).

--- Value marriages. This community holds a Biblical vision of the sanctity of marriage; in the event of marital difficulties encountered while living as members of the College, married persons are encouraged to seek the support of the Christian community in taking every step possible to move toward a renewed, restored, and reconciled relationship, and to avoid divorce.

--- Refrain from practices that are Biblically condemned*, including (but not limited to): drunkenness; swearing/profane language; gossip; harassment/violence; involvement in the occult; and sexual sins.
